

## Continued Investment in Marches Stations



Transport for Wales (TfW) is continuing to implement its Station Improvement Vision initiative on the Borderlands line between Wrexham and Bidston. The investment has improved 13 stations since the start of the programme in October 2019.

Despite the challenges presented by Covid-19, TfW is keen to move forward with its plans. Improvements include deep cleaning, the rebranding of shelters and station furniture, the relining of car park bays, repainting and renewing stair nosings, and cutting back overgrown vegetation. Ken Skates, minister for economy, transport and North Wales, said: "This is another example of our commitment to improving transport in North Wales. Train stations are gateways to communities and the Station Improvement Vision will help ensure passengers have a positive experience when using our rail network."

James Price, TfW chief executive, added: "I'm delighted to see great progress being made on the Borderlands line as part of our Station Improvement Vision. Despite the challenging circumstances, we're committed to delivering short and long term improvements on this important rail route linking communities in North Wales and on the Wirral, as part of our wider vision of delivering a public transport network that the people of Wales and the Borders are proud of."
