

Work Goes Ahead on the East-West Rail Link

Work underway at Bletchley on the strategically important new East West Rail project, which EEH says will be a vital part of their strategy for the next thirty years

More parts of the Bletchley flyover being removed as part of work to rebuild the railway linking Oxford and Cambridge via Bletchley in Buckinghamshire. The Bletchley flyover continued to carry freight trains after passenger trains ended on this line in the 1960s. Future passenger trains will need to travel on the flyover, which carries the line over the West Coast Main Line. However, we need to rebuild it to modern standards.
